
## Skills Programme Underspend 2023/24






## Skills Programme Underspend

- Additional £428 underspend agreed in addition to the unallocated phase two £400K (£828 in total)
- Total agreed drawdown for 23/23 is £1.5M from the £2.339M allocation





Project Challenges	Mitigation
Reducing the underspend for 23/24	Skills projects with business case approval to spend ahead of profile if they have capacity to do so
Reducing potential underspend in 24/25	Engage with capital projects to explore ways of supporting their skills shortages and outcomes
Reducing potential underspend in 24/25	Skills programme manager to provide Scottish government with business proposal for Academy approach to delivery
Procurement and internal organisation processes can be time consuming for projects	Programme Manager to work with individual project sponsors and procurement service to create an efficient and timely process for approving spend on project activities
Business case writers not fully up to speed with UK Treasury Green Book process	Addition training from UK Treasury for those who are not Green Book trained. Skills delivery group members will share good practice with projects starting the Green Book Process
Recent subsidy control guidelines have delayed the progress of business cases	Addition support has been sought from economic consultants to support business case progress
